Thank you for your interest in Global Humanitaria USA's Young Professionals Board! Global Humanitaria USA is thrilled to establish a Board of talented, engaged professionals in the New York City area to help raise awareness about our work and further our mission.

Mission and Work

Global Humanitaria's global mission is to work with local communities to help identify their needs and to create self-sustainable development programs that will promote long-term positive change while advocating to end the injustices that created them in the first place.

Our programs reach some of the most vulnerable and marginalized communities in Bolivia, Colombia, Guatemala, Peru, Ivory Coast, Cambodia, and India. We operate in a need-based manner mainly focusing on education, health, food security and nutrition, women's rights, and child protection services. Global Humanitaria hires only local staff to promote professional opportunities in the regions we operate. We ensure all programs are entirely community-led and truly respond to the self-identified needs of the populations we serve.

Global Humanitaria USA programs include cross-cultural sensitivity training for professionals in New York City working with unaccompanied minors from countries where we run programs internationally and have focused expertise.

Young Professionals Board: What Will We Do?

Global Humanitaria USA is establishing a Young Professionals Board to raise awareness about our work and support the full time staff in New York City. The main functions of this inaugural board will be to:

- Serve as an advocate for Global Humanitaria USA by leveraging personal and professional networks on behalf of our mission.
- Lend professional expertise in consultation with Global Humanitaria USA staff to execute projects and programs
- Devise, plan and execute two social, awareness-raising or small-round fundraising events to support our work
- Attend in-person meetings every six weeks to establish plans for all YP Board activities
- Donate \$200 to support all Young Professionals Board activities

The founding Young Professionals Board will be composed of individuals committed to serving for six months from June 1, 2015-December 31, 2015. Upon the new year, Board members will have the option to re-commit for the full fiscal year (Jan-Dec 2016), at which point a \$400 donation will be due to Global Humanitaria USA.
